

#4103/4 C - CHA CHA PRINT VEST

TRENDSETTER YARNS USED:

Cha Cha Print #121-3(4,5)/100gr. Trendsetter Needles #15

SIZES: Sm(33"), Med(37"), Lg(41"). Finished size is about 4" larger.

GAUGE: With #15 needle and Cha Cha Print in Stock St.; 4sts x 6 rows = 4".

STITCHES USED:

<u>Garter St.:</u> KNIT every row.

Stock St.:

Row 1: (RS) Knit across the row.

Row 2: Purl across the row.

#4103/4 C - CHA CHA PRINT VEST - KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

BODY: Worked in one piece from back up and over the shoulders down each front. With #15 needle and Cha Cha Print, Cast on 19(21,23)sts. Work in Garter St. for 3 rows. Change to Stock St. and continue until 15" from the cast on. Bind off 2(2,2)sts at the beginning of the next 2 rows. Decrease 1 stitch each end every other row 1x. Change to work as follows:

Row 1: (RS) 2sts Garter, 9(11,13)sts Stock St., 2sts Garter

Continue in this manner until the armhole is 7 $\frac{1}{2}(8,8 \frac{1}{2})$ ". Place a colored marker each end as shoulder marker. Work as follows on the next RS row. Work 3(4,5)sts. Bind off the center 7sts. Join new yarn and work the other neck edge as set. Continue with 3(4,5)sts each side for 4 rows. Continue, Increasing 1 stitch each neck edge on next RS row and then every RS row 4x. **AT THE SAME TIME:** When the front armhole is 7 $\frac{1}{2}(8,8 \frac{1}{2})$ " from shoulder marker. Change all stitches to Stock St. and Increase 1 stitch each arm side edge 1x to start finishing armholes. Cast on 2sts each arm side edge 1x to finish armholes. Continue in Stock St. with 10(11,12)sts each front until 3 rows less than 15" from the end of armhole. Change to Garter St. for 3 rows. Bind off in pattern.

FINISHING: Sew the side seams closed. Bury tails carefully.
